


The number of papers by authors from different countries are represented by the area of the rectangular box representing each country.

The assignment of papers to countries was done by a simplified process, using the data from the author questionnaire, due to a lack of more precise data. A paper with three authors from Cuba and Sweden is counted as 1/2 paper from Cuba and 1/2 paper from Sweden. (A paper with one author from USA and Israel would be treated similarly.) The second set of cartograms shows the total number of *authors*. Thus, a paper with seven authors will contribute seven authors to the cartogram. Again, a paper with three authors from Cuba and Sweden is counted as 1.5 authors from Cuba and 1.5 authors from Sweden.

The average relative error for the area representation of submitted papers/authors was around 4%. For accepted papers/authors, it was around 2%. The maximum relative error for the area representation of submitted papers/authors was around 15%. For accepted papers/authors, it was around 8%.




Accepted/Rejected Papers (total = 139)


Accepted Papers (total = 41)

Submitted Authors (total = 348)




Accepted/Rejected Authors (total = 348)
